About Trail of the Ancients

Trail of the Ancients (TotA) is a 114-mile route across the broken, arid terrain of the Ancestral Puebloan people. Along the route, which offers a complete Mesa Verde Country experience along a single roadway, visitors can see clues about the ancient civilization with cliff dwellings, rock art and pottery sherds. Attractions along the byway include Hovenweep National Monument and Mesa Verde National Park, which both contain dense clusters of remains. The Canyons of the Ancients National Monument Visitors Center and Museum (CANM) in Dolores offers background and interpretive information. One branch of the byway leads to the Four Corners Area, connecting with Utah's Trail of the Ancients byway.

Motorcycle Travel in Mesa Verde Country

The Mesa Verde Country region of southwest Colorado is a motorcyclist's paradise, with endless open roads winding through stunning canyons, forests, and high desert. The towns of Dolores, Mancos, and Cortez serve as gateways to adventure for exploring TotA on two wheels. TotA offers a chance to learn about the architecture, culture, and history of the ancestral Puebloan peoples who inhabited this Four Corners region centuries ago. It's an ideal ride for history buffs!
